60 Years in Greece

On Wednesday, June 25th 2008 more than 550 guests, including alumni, friends, and donors, gathered at the Peristilion, Zappeion Hall to celebrate the Fulbright Foundation's 60th anniversary. Guests were welcomed by the Executive Director Artemis Zenetou and event volunteers / Fulbright alumni Pavlos Antoniadis, Kalli Bezevengi, Vassiliki Dimitriadi, Dimitra Ioannidou, Thodoris Zafeiropoulos and Irini Steirou, to the sounds of musician and Fulbright scholar Michalis Katachanas improvising on his viola. Following her welcoming remarks, Artemis Zenetou read a message by Prime Minister Kostas Karamanlis, in which he asserted how pioneering initiatives such as the Fulbright Program are instrumental in meeting the challenges of a changing world. The event was addressed by the President of the Parliament of the Hellenes Dimitris Sioufas, the Minister of Foreign Affairs Mrs. Dora Bakoyianni (through a video-message), the Minister of Education and Religious Affairs Evripidis Stylianidis and the Ambassador of the United States Daniel V. Speckhard. Two generations of Fulbright alumni, represented by Edmund Keeley and Emmanuela Truli, shared their reminiscences. Professor Keeley arrived in Greece as a Fulbright scholar in 1949, while Emanuela Truli traveled to the United States just before 9/11. The highlight of the evening was the Fulbright Awards ceremony, during which 71 grants were presented to Greek and American scholars. This was preceded by the acknowledgment of the Foundation's donors for their invaluable support of the Foundation's Scholarship Program. The Executive Director presented the publication 60 Years in Greece, The Fulbright Foundation, which outlines the Foundation's historic journey from 1948 to the present. The publication includes rare archival photos and essays. The evening concluded with the screening of the film 60 Years Fulbright, featuring American and Greek Fulbright alumni from then and now. Musician and Fulbright alumnus George Kaloudis composed the film's music score, "Swell."





Letter from the Executive Director



n this issue of Fulbright News we invite you to celebrate an important milestone in the history of Educational and Cultural Exchanges between the United States and Greece. In 1948, the Fulbright Founda-

tion was established in Greece. It is the oldest Fulbright Program in Europe and the second oldest continuously operating program in the world. The Foundation's objective is to broaden and strengthen mutual understanding between Greece and the United States by offering educational and cultural exchange opportunities to Greek and American students, scholars, researchers, and artists. Since 1948, the Fulbright Foundation in Greece has offered free advisory services for studies in the United States to thousands of individuals and has awarded grants to more than 4,500 Greeks and Americans.


At sixty, the Fulbright exchange program has matured into an international success story. From a modest program that brought 35 students and a single professor to the United States in 1948 and sent 65 Americans abroad, the Fulbright has grown into the premier educational exchange program in the world. To date, some 280,000 "Fulbrighters" -106,000 from the United States and 174,000 from other countries - have participated in the Program since its inception. The Fulbright Program awards approximately 6,000 grants annually to scholars from the United States and 155 other countries. Fulbright involves nearly every discipline in the arts and humanities, commerce and finance, science and technology, education, journalism, media and government. It counts among its alumni distinguished men and women in almost every country. They include poets and presidents, Nobel laureates, Pulitzer Prize winners, prime ministers and heads of state, professors and scientists, ambassadors and artists, business leaders, economists, physicians, actors, financiers, Supreme Court justices and company presidents.

Today, the Fulbright Foundation continues to offer scholarships and educational advice to Greek and American scholars, while also introducing new initiatives to promote educational and cultural exchanges between the two countries.

The US University Fair Discovering a World of New Study Opportunities

The 14th US University Fair was held on 8 October 2008 at the Athens Crowne Plaza. More than 500 students, parents, high school and university counselors attended the event. The Fair offers prospective students the unique opportunity to meet American university representatives and Fulbright advisors; to inquire about graduate and undergraduate degree programs, admission requirements, program deadlines, and campus life at each institution; and to gather information about Fulbright scholarships and standardized admission tests. The event is free and open to the public and it is the only one of its kind in Greece. During this year's Fair, Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Public Diplomacy Colleen P. Graffy and US Embassy Counselor for Public Affairs and Chairman of the Fulbright Board of Directors Thomas Miller met with students and university career counselors from Greek universities.

International Education Week



International Education Week is an opportunity to celebrate the benefits of international education and exchange worldwide. The Fulbright Foundation organized the "Fulbright Open House" in Athens and Thessaloniki. The Open House featured Fulbright staff and scholars who presented the US educational system, the application process and Fulbright scholarship opportunities. Fulbright alumni discussed their experiences in US campuses and noted similarities and differences between student life in Greece and the United States. Participants and

speakers stayed long after the program had ended, talking among themselves.

Cultural Enrichment Program for American Educators

Greece was selected along with Bulgaria to organize a Fulbright-Hays seminar for American educators. The seminar offers a unique experience of professional and personal enrichment, leading to a better understanding of Greece's history, culture and people and acts as a forum for the development of new international educational projects and collaborations. The objective of the seminar, which took place in Greece between June 1-19, 2008, was to provide an overview of Greece and Greek historyand culture, past and present. Participants were introduced to the country's history and culture and experienced contemporary life through visits to archaeological sites, schools, nature reserves, museums and cultural centers. Visits were combined with lectures by professional staff, which were tied in with the educational, political, cultural and historical significance of the places visited.

In the questionnaires they filled out before departing Greece for Bulgaria, the 16 educators who participated in the program expressed their appreciation of the entire experience.

International Fulbright Science and Technology Awards

The International Fulbright Science and Technology Awards are given to promising graduate students to undertake PhD study at top US universities in the fields of science, technology or engineering. Approximately 40 awards are offered each year to graduate students from around the world who demonstrate unique aptitude and innovation in scientific fields, leadership potential and the ability to be a cultural ambassador of their country.

This year Greece is represented by Aikaterini Ziotopoulou, a graduate of the National Technical University of Athens, who is studying Civil Engineering at the University of California, Davis, CA.

Initiatives to Promote Educational & Cultural Exchanges

Each year, the Fulbright Foundation in Greece develops new educational and cultural programs to promote mutual understanding and creative collaborations between Greece and the United States of America.

he "Great Ideas" series is an initiative of the Fulbright Foundation to celebrate the 60 years of educational and cultural connection between Greece and the United States. The goal of the series is to bring noted American experts and artists to Greece to perform and to discuss topics of interest to the Greek and American public. AN EVENING WITH OLGA BROUMAS

n 19 November 2008, award-winning poet and translator Olga Broumas gave a reading entitled "Translation and Original: The Journey of Poetry." Fulbright alumna Broumas, treated a mesmerized audience to an evening of poetry at the Gennadius Library of the American School of Classical Studies. The event was jointly organized by the Gennadius Library and the Fulbright Foundation in Greece. The readings were in Greek and English and included poems by Odysseus Elytis, Kiki Dimoula, Stanley Kunitz, W.C. Williams and Olga Broumas.



Olga Broumas finished the Tositseion Arsakeion in Athens Greece and left for advanced study in the United States with the help of a Fulbright Fellowship in 1967. In 1977, her first collection of poems, *Beginning with O*, won the Yale Younger Poets Award, the first time a non-native speaker of English was so honored. Since then, she has published six more collections of poetry, collected in *Rave* in 2000, and four books of translations of Odysseas Elytis, collected in *Eros*, *Eros*, *Eros* in 1999. A CD of her reciting from these books appeared in 2001. She is currently working on the Selected Translations of Kiki Dimoula for Yale University Press, for the Margellos World Republic of Letters translations series.

Olga Broumas' work has been honored with fellowships from the John Simon Guggenheim Foundation and the National Endowment of the Arts, among others. She is the Director of Creative Writing at Brandeis University near Boston, Massachusetts, and travels widely to present and perform her work.



The exchange program will offer an in-depth experience of American life and culture. While the Greek participants will be the primary beneficiaries of the internship experience, the US institutions and individuals involved in the program will also gain from the cultural and professional exchange.

Education is a slow-moving but powerful force. It may not be fast enough or strong enough to save us from catastrophe, but it is the strongest force available.
